

20 Foreclosure prevention resources

A clerk of court may be able to delay the foreclosure process for up to 60 days as needed. The delay of the foreclosure hearing will provide the homeowner more time to work out a payment plan with the bank, mortgage servicer, or lender. The ultimate goal of the program is to allow the homeowner to stay in the home.

25 UTILITY SHUT-OFF PREVENTION RESOURCES

UTILITY CONSERVATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Local utility companies usually offer utility conservation assist-need programs, typically at no cost. These measures, like long lasting light bulbs, weather-stripping for doors and windows and filters for furnaces can often cut your bill by as much as one-third to one-half. CONTACT THE UTILITY COMPANY

If you anticipate you won't be able to pay your bill, reach out to the utility company as soon as possible. Most utility companies will allow you to fall behind 2-3 payments before shut off as long as you tell them when you can pay it. For example, if you plan on utilizing a resource in this guide, tell them when you'll be approved for help. See your bill or payment portal for contact information.

Many utility companies offer discounted rates and payment plans to elderly and low-income people. Ask your utility company today.

PROGRAMS THAT AVERAGE BILLS THROUGHOUT YEAR

We use different amounts of energy depending on the season. Sometimes we fall behind on our energy bills during periods when we use a lot of energy and incur high bills, like during summer in hot, humid North Carolina. **Many energy utilities offer programs that average your periods of high and low usage and allow you to pay one set monthly payment all year long.** This way, you can budget for one fixed price.

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103 UNDERSTANDING EVICTION

Disclaimer: This guide is not meant to provide legal advice. The following is an overview of the eviction process. Contact the agencies listed below as soon as you receive a notice from your landlord. Appointment slots fill up fast and funds are quickly depleted.

Know Your Rights:

• A verbal or written notice from your landlord to move out is not a legal eviction. The only legal way a landlord can evict is through a court order.

• When facing eviction, you will receive a summons and have the right to appear in small claims court to present your defense. You may also bring counterclaims to court, such as evidence of a landlord not making repairs to the property.

• North Carolina law generally doesn't allow tenants to withhold rent until repairs are made. But in some specific instances a judge or magistrate can order the rent to be held.

• Landlords cannot change the locks or withhold or remove belongings before an eviction is granted. If you miss your court date: You have 10 days to appeal the eviction ruling and have the right to stay in the unit during the appeal as long as you continue to pay rent.

• North Carolina laws protect you from retaliatory eviction. Landlords cannot evict as retribution for calling code enforcement, asking for repairs, or organizing with other tenants.

• Hiring an attorney isn't required but often landlords are much more likely to appear in court with a lawyer than the tenant facing eviction.

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104 UNDERSTANDING FORECLOSURE

The following are resources for understanding foreclosure.

Understanding Foreclosure

Foreclosure is a legal process in which a lender attempts to recover the balance of a loan from a borrower who has stopped making payments to the lender by forcing the sale of the asset (usually the home) used as the collateral for the loan.

If You Receive a Foreclosure Notice in the Mail

If you receive a foreclosure notice in the mail, it means you've fallen far enough behind in your mortgage payments that your lender intends to take your property and sell it off unless you make up the late payments.

If You Find Yourself in Need of Foreclosure Prevention Assistance

Don't delay seeking help! The homeowner is given a limited period of time where they have a chance to cure the default and pay all amounts due, including interest, penalties, attorney charges and any other fees allowed by the law or the mortgage. Contact your mortgage lender as soon as you know you will be unable to make your mortgage payments. Let them know of your circumstances. Contact your lender: Find out the exact details of what the lender believes you did or did not do. Ask the lender what you can do to remedy the default. Some lenders will work with you, so it doesn't hurt to ask.

105 MEDICAID VS. MEDICARE

The following are resources for understanding your healthcare options.

Medicaid Insurance

Program that provides free or low-cost health coverage to some low-income people, families and children, pregnant women, the seniors/elderly, and people with disabilities. Medicaid benefits and program names vary somewhat between states.

Medicaid may help pay for certain medical expenses including:

- Doctor Bills
- Hospital Bills
- Prescriptions (excluding prescriptions for Medicare beneficiaries)
- Vision Care
- Dental Care
- Medicare Premiums
- Nursing Home Care

Medicare Insurance

Medicare is a federal program that offers health insurance to American citizens and other eligible individuals. The program is often called Original Medicare. It has two parts-Part A and Part B.

Eligibility Requirements

- Age 65 or older
- Younger than 65 with a qualifying disability

• Any age with a diagnosis of End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) or Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS)

106 SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT DEFINITIONS

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The following are resources for people seeking to understand substance abuse treatment.

Alcoholics Anonymous

A fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking.

Al-Anon

Support groups work to equip loved ones with the tools they need to support the addict's recovery efforts, while nurturing and taking care of themselves along the way.

Narcotics Anonymous

Offers recovery from the effects of addiction through working a twelve-step program, including regular attendance at group meetings. The group atmosphere provides help from peers and offers an ongoing support network for addicts who wish to pursue and maintain a drug-free lifestyle.

Addiction Treatment Centers

Addiction treatment centers provide a monitored environment where you will get the medical attention you need, as well as the emotional support to overcome drug or alcohol abuse. Inpatient programs offer the highest level of treatment care, with medically supervised detoxification and around-the-clock care and support.
